FROM THE PASTOR

This is the last Sunday after Pentecost! Next Sunday will be the first of Advent. This is a time of preparation. Even if the Church does not oblige us to do Penance, it is advisable to do some penance to get ready for Christmas!

As every year, we will have our traditional secret friend during Advent. If you plan to come on Christmas, Epiphany Party on January 10th, then you need to come and put your name in the basket. Once done, you will pick a name from the same basket. During the entire Advent, you will pray for that parishioner. On January 10th, you will give your present to that parishioner. Of course, there will be two baskets; one for the children and one for the adults as we do not enjoy the same toys! It is a gracious time in which we can share our appreciation to be together and enjoy the time of Christmas.

The word Advent means beginning so there is also a time where we can pause and take more time to pray and prepare. As we count down with our Advent calendar, it is good to brush up our tradition such as lighting a candle for evening prayer with the family. I have seen some families setting up the Nativity scene on the first day of Advent where the children of the family are represented as a sheep. Every day, as they behave, they can move up the sheep as a race to the crib to be on Christmas night. What an educational tool as they get a story every night, they also make an effort to be good from Advent.

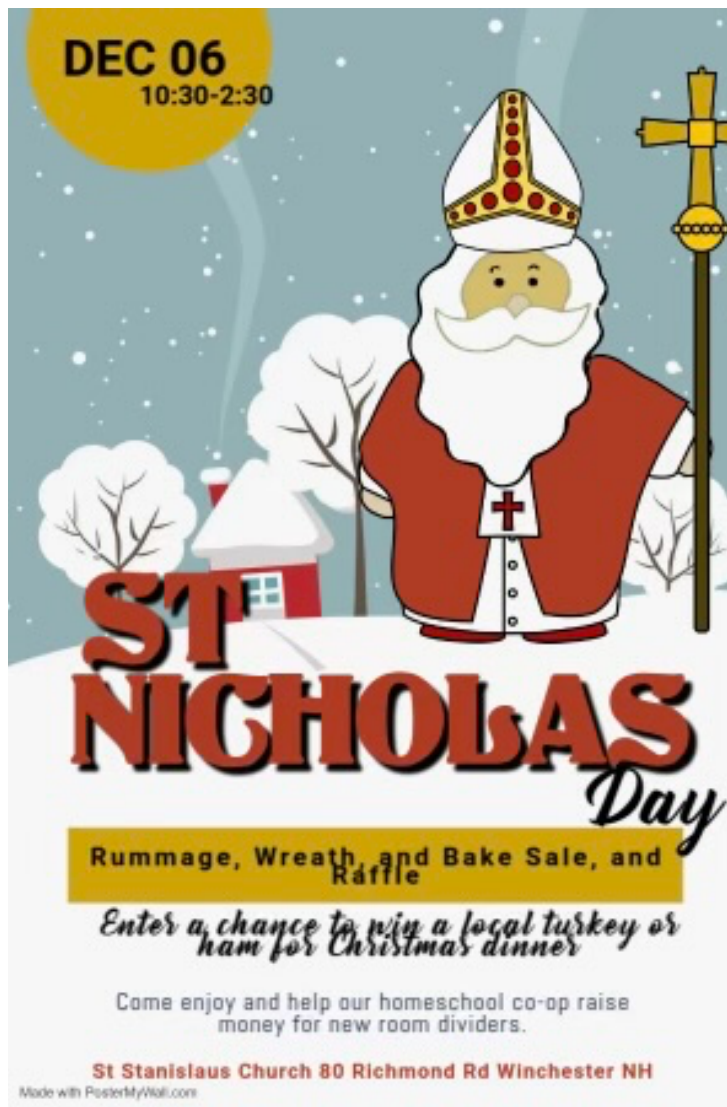
