FROM THE PASTOR

On June 29, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul honors the two pillars who poured out their blood in Rome. Beyond their heroic martyrdoms, this day calls us to celebrate the visible, unbroken line of authority they left behind: the gift of apostolic succession.

In the second century, when false teachings threatened to fracture the early Christian community, Saint Irenaeus of Lyon stepped forward to defend the true faith. In his landmark work *Against Heresies*, he argued that the ultimate defense against spiritual error is a humble submission to the bishops who legitimately succeed the Apostles. He wrote: *"It is necessary to obey the presbyters who are in the Church—those who, as I have shown, possess the succession from the apostles; those who, together with the succession of the episcopate, have received the certain gift of truth."* To prove this point universally, Saint Irenaeus pointed directly to the Church of Rome, founded by Peter and Paul. He famously declared that because of Rome's preeminent authority, *"it is a matter of necessity that every Church should agree with this Church, on account of its preeminent authority."* He then listed the continuous succession of Roman bishops, from Linus right down to his own day, as definitive proof of the true, uncorrupted Catholic faith.

As we celebrate this solemnity, we are reminded that our submission to the Catholic Church is not a submission to mere human ideas, but a submission to the truth of Christ, preserved intact for two millennia through the successors of Saint Peter. Let us pray for our Holy Father and our bishops, thanking God for the unbroken chain of apostolic succession that anchors our souls in the truth.
