### **FROM THE PASTOR**

Happy New Year! On Wednesday, we will go back to the regular liturgical calendar with the Sanctoral. That means, strictly speaking, that Christmas season is over even if a tradition will keep it up to Feb. 2<sup>nd</sup>. Indeed, the Baptism of the Lord is the Octave of Epiphany. We will have then a short period with Sundays after Epiphany before preparing Lent with Septuagesima on Feb. 1<sup>st</sup>. It is a blessed time where we can benefit from the long liturgical tradition of the Church.

Now that we go back to our routine! While we still enjoy the Winter season, do we realize the work that is needed in a Parish?

There is a lot of work to be done in a parish: cleaning, plowing, mowing, supplies ordering and storage, and other works needed according to the season, building repair... There is work that is visible and work that is invisible.

Yes! We need volunteers in counting collection, ushering, outdoors maintenance... We all have occupations. In getting more volunteers, we do less work individually. For instance, if we have 4 teams of 2 counting collections, each team will count once a month. It is the same with all easy work to be done. The Parish needs volunteers!

## Commemoration of the Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ

As an adult man, Christ came to the banks of the Jordan River to be baptized by John the Baptist, his forerunner. Although He Himself was without sin, He did not distance Himself from sinful people. He entered the waters of the Jordan with them to receive purification. This gesture, which marks the beginning of Christ's public ministry, is consistent with the spirit of the Incarnation. The meaning of this act of divine humility is contained in one word: charity, which is the very name of God. The Apostle John writes: "By this hath the charity of God appeared towards us, because God hath sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we may live by him" (1 John 4:9).

Saint Matthew describes Christ's baptism in this way: "And Jesus being baptized, forthwith came out of the water: and lo, the heavens were opened to him: and he saw the Spirit of God descending as a dove, and coming upon him. And behold a voice from heaven, saying: This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased" (Mt 3:16-17).

Christ's baptism remarkably shows all three Persons of the Trinity at the same time: the Son being baptized, the Holy Spirit descending, and the Father speaking from the heavens. In this event, the Father and the Holy Spirit confirm the deity of Christ, and Jesus submits to his Father's will. On the day of his baptism, Jesus was presented by his Father as the Son sent to accomplish the work of salvation. Christ's mission is confirmed by the testimony of God the Father. The heavens, closed by Adam's sin, open, and the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus.

The commemoration of the Baptism of the Lord, on the one hand, reveals Jesus to us as the beloved Son of God, sent by the Father in the power of the Holy Spirit for the salvation of mankind, and on the other hand, it draws attention to the reality of our own baptism. In this sacrament, we experience the saving power of Christ, which liberates us from the bondage of sin. We are also filled with the Holy Spirit, and in this way each of us becomes a beloved child of God.

## Parish activities:

Men's group, Women's group, Youth group once a month, Conference on Wednesdays every other week, St. Joseph Men's group work, Saint Ann's meal group, Catechism for Sacraments, Altar boys, Homeschool Co-op twice a week, Adoration twice a week. Volunteering: Not yet in, talk to a priest!

## Confessions:

Are heard before each Mass and on demand.

## Baptism:

Registered and active parishioners should call well ahead of the baptism to get the form. A class will be provided. The form should be submitted before the ceremony.

## Holy Matrimony:

Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Catholic Church. There is a six-month preparation prior the desired date of wedding. It is available for registered and active parishioners.

## First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year.
