6. Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
9. I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart.
12. I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

## Why Campfire?

It is a scouting tradition to end the day by a Campfire. "You are in a good mood: sing! But "the Scout is always in a good mood". So sing [...] a troop that does not sing is a troop that does not march. And a troop that sings, "walks", even when sitting around the campfire..." Fr. Jacques Sevin, sj.

Fr. Jacques Sevin was the founder of the Scouts de France in the '20s. His idea was to use the foundation of Lord Baden Powell and baptize it. He brought the Chivalry spirit to it and more importantly redesigned the Law by rooting it in the Gospel. Then, he asked his Dominican friends to comment according to the Summa of Saint Thomas Aquinas. One hundred years later, the fruits are visible like the flock you see in the Chartres Pilgrimage or less visible at first in the French clergy (around 70% were Scouts).

For scouts, the Campfire is more than a tradition or something you have to do, it is a way of life. It is a full and important activity where you bring Joy to all and comfort those who need it.

It is a time where there is wave form excitement to preparation of the night. From skits to songs, the scouts participate in Joy sharing the same spirit willed by Fr. Sevin: express Joy in games. That Joy is particularly expressed towards the end when songs are calmer to prepare the evening prayer.

Saying the Rosary together after Campfire is a dedicated moment where all ask forgiveness for their misdeeds remembering the song the Fire legend: "My lesson, the last one, tells you: My children, we do nothing on earth except by consuming ourselves!"

## FROM THE PASTOR

Summer is nigh! Warm weather is back, and we can enjoy the outdoors. Campfires, barbecue, games and so forth... will bring its usual joy and excitement. On top of that, there will be July 4<sup>th</sup>, and other family gathering, a lot of activities for the body and spirit to recover from Winter and Spring.

What about souls? How do we treat them? Where do we get warmth for them? How to get the same excitement? A few questions that come back every year around that time. We are very good in taking care of our bodies, and finding activities to rejoice but do I apply the same energy on our soul? There is a refrain from a French hymn saying: "I only have one soul, which must be saved; From the eternal flame I want to preserve it." Before hymn were more direct and were providing you a good sense of direction we should take. There were very popular.

Indeed, as our bodies are going to rest during this Summer, how do we rest our souls, restore them, refresh them? Of course, there are many options available: Mass, more than once a week; working better on examination of conscience; being consistent in Morning & Evening prayer; prayers with the family; a spiritual reading; some time in meditation... All these are easy steps accessible to all! It just needs a tiny effort.

Sometimes, we do the contrary: as we rest the body, we rest the soul in a different way: being lax on our spiritual duties; asking dispensation from Mass on Sundays because of travels. In fact, Summer is a very good and accurate thermometer of our spiritual life. If we are in love with God, then everything we do is around our spiritual duties. God first! If we see too much relaxation, it might be a sign that we need to love more God and bring Him at the center of our life! Yes, indeed, we have a soul which much be saved! Take a moment to do an examination of conscience in your lives and take resolution to have a wonderful Summer with God and the Blessed Virgin Mary! You will not regret it, you will see changes in your life!
