FROM THE PASTOR

The end of June is giving us a lot of feasts: Saint John the Baptist Tuesday, June 29th Saint Peter and Paul. The feast of Saint Peter in Paul is usually the tradition period of the year where ordinations take place rooting us to the very first Pope and the great and zealous preacher. Saturday, His Em. Cardinal Müller will ordain five deacons to the Holy Priesthood amongst them Dc. Grzegorz Krol will become priest forever. Please pray for them!

June 29th is also the day in which all Archbishops of the world will receive the pallium from the Pope. Pallium means cloak. It is a symbol of jurisdiction delegated to them by the Holy See. It is only used at mass over the chasuble of the archbishop. If you remember, on January 21st, feast of Saint Agnes, some lambs are presented to the Pope to be blessed, then they take the wool out of them and place it in a case where it will rest at the place of the remains of Saint Peter in the basilica of Rome. It can be seen in the crypt of the Basilica. Pope Leo XIV will impose the Pallia over the shoulders of the new Archbishops after an oath. It is a great sign of unity that can be seen on the shoulder of every archbishop of the world. It is a great opportunity to pray for the new archbishops and the newly ordained priests this week all united in the wonderful feast of Saint Peter and Paul.

“Behold this Heart”

“Behold this Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to consuming itself to witness its love. And in return, I receive from most of them only ingratitude from their irreverences and their sacrileges and by the coldness and contempt that they have for Me in this sacrament of love” These are the very words of Jesus to Saint Margaret Mary.

At the beginning of the world He created us. He placed our first parents in a garden of delights, gave them the gifts of immortality, infused knowledge, impassibility, perfect control over their passions. But they, dissatisfied with so many gifts, turned away. Where any other than God would have left us in the mud of our sins, He wanted to promise us a Savior, He made a covenant with a people, made them grow, freed them from slavery. But this people turned away from their God to idols, to live in pleasure and indifference, forgetting their Creator. Finally, he sent them his only Son. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. The Son of God became man, so that we might be made gods. To our ingratitude, to our outrages, the Most Holy Trinity responded with an outpouring of goodness. God took on flesh, God took on a human body and soul. God took on a Heart! Oh, the summit of divine love! God took a flaming Heart to melt the ice in our hearts. The Son of God made man, Jesus Christ, was willing to suffer the worst torments to redeem us at the highest price: the price of love. “Greater love than this no man hath, that a man lay down his life for his friends”. This Heart that so loved mankind is the Heart pierced by the lance on Good Friday evening, from which blood and water gushed forth. It is this open Heart from which the Catholic Church was born, this fecund source in which we were washed by baptism and made children of God. But alas, we have cut ourselves off from this source. Like the Hebrews of old, we have turned away from our Savior, to follow the chimeras of absolute progress. Man-God has replaced God-made-man. It's time for us to be totally converted to him, to let our hearts of stone be melted in the fiery furnace of his love. This is the most beautiful reparation we can make: the conversion of our hearts.

Parish activities:

Registered and active parishioners should call well ahead of the baptism to get the form. A class will be provided. The form should be submitted before the ceremony.

Holy Matrimony:

Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Catholic Church. There is a six-month preparation prior the desired date of wedding. It is available for registered and active parishioners.

First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year.
