First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year. Adults who didn't receive some sacraments or who have questions about their reception should talk to the Pastor who will advise the candidates.

Saint Raphael is one of the three Archangels in the Bible. The mission of Archangels is to accompany men in a different way of the guardian angels. Saint Raphael is invoked by physician, travelers, blind people and matchmaker. He is the healer as his name signifies God heals, רפאֵל. It is in the Book of Tobit that we meet Raphael. Following an accident, Tobit becomes blind and feels death approaching; his family, previously rich, loses all monies. Tobit instructs his son Tobiah to go to Media, to recover his money. Looking for a traveling companion, he met the archangel Raphael hidden in the guise of a young man.

Tobiah is attacked by a large fish and the Archangel orders him to seize it and to remove his heart and liver useful for medicine. Later, Raphael encourages Tobiah to marry Sarah. He uses the fish heart and liver to drive away demons from the bedroom. Going back to his father with the money and his wife, he uses the fish gall to cure the blindness of his father. Before leaving Tobiah, Raphael reveals his identity inspiring to Tobit a hymn of praise. Let's pray the Archangel to be our guide and intercessor.

“God and Lord of the angels, to whom you have entrusted the care of men, I offer you the merits of all these superior spirits, and particularly those of your archangel Raphael. Although he is one of the princes who stand before your throne in heaven, he has nevertheless agreed to be the guide and companion of young Tobias on earth, to preserve him, during his journey, from the dangers of soul and body.

I beg you, from the depths of my heart, to deign to give me this holy archangel as my guide, guardian and protector, so that his powerful intercession with you, during this novena, may make me obtain the grace (formulate the grace requested) that I implore for your greatest honor and glory. Amen.

Saint Raphael, angel of health, love, joy and light, pray for us.

FROM THE PASTOR

The last week was very busy with removing useless accumulated objects in any kind from past bazaars. In the meantime, the company was working to help redirecting water that causes flood in the basements of the church and the rectory. The worked in both locations as both had cracks in the foundation. It was an emergency work. We have had two floods one major in Summer 2023 and a minor one during the last Spring of the year. We couldn't postpone any more unless we like to gamble. Indeed, I was told that In New England, these events happen every five to ten years. Lucky us for getting every year! The survey conducted earlier this year stated some proposal for improvements: Installation of window well covers at every window well; uphill grass swale to intercept stormwater runoff and divert it around the parking lot/building; re-grading the parking lot so that runoff drains away from the building. Window well and gutters are the cheapest options that are available and when I say cheapest it is amongst the others because as you know this is not cheap!

The past two months, we have seen a decrease in the Sunday offertory collections. Last April, I preached on tithing. The word was even heard outside of the parish that priests are asking me to share that homily. I would like to encourage you to be consistent in your donation that we can face the reality! I leave you with that quote: Malachi 3:7-10: “Return to me, and I will return to you, says the Lord of hosts.... Bring the *whole tithe* into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house, and try me in this, says the Lord of hosts: Shall I not open the floodgates of heaven, to pour down blessing upon you without measure?”

Thank you for the few generous families that make sacrifices again. Let's work all together! God bless you.
