FROM THE PASTOR

Alleluia! Resurrexit sicut dixit. Back in times, Christians will salute themselves using the Liturgical expression Laudetur Jesus Christus, the people saluted will reply: Semper et ubique or in aeternum Amen. During Easter, they will use the risen salutation we sing. The Eastern rites, especially Byzantines, use Христос воскрес! (Christ is risen) to which the reply is Воистину воскрес! (Truly, He is risen).

Even in saluting, the Joy was expressed in any form surrounding people with Christianity expressions making lives centered on Christ. Today, we are celebrating the Resurrection of Our Lord, and we will do it for a long time as the Liturgy will bring us to contemplate all mysteries of our faith.

Lent was worth it or should be. If we had a great Lent, we should be able to see it in our lives. We have changed or should have changed. Every Lent, we learn something in our lives, something that we keep from now on. It could be a penance, a resolution something that brought us to humility in our daily life. A visible sign of humility in submitting to Our Lord and His bride.

This week is a week of celebration! We celebrate the Resurrection but let us not forget that if there is a resurrection, there was death! If we want to rise with Him, that means we need to die in Him. What death is that if not the death of our Pride! The one that we nurture on daily basis, trying to justify our position, our sins against Him. This is the lesson of every Lent. Little by little, we understand that our Pride is not worth it. Little by little, we are depriving ourselves of that Pride because we are the Risen people! Let us rise with Him!

Resurrexi

I am risen... This is Easter morning, the most important day of the year, of our lives, the goal towards which we walk in this valley of tears, the glory of the heavenly Jerusalem. Death has been conquered, sin has been destroyed, suffering has become salvation. And in the long-awaited exuberance of this triumphal feast, the Church immediately calms us down, and introduces us, not to the fanfare and blaze of power of the King of kings, but to the gentleness and intimacy of the relationship between the Father and the Son. The Son, Who became obedient unto death, presents Himself before the Father, Whom He loves so much, and simply says: "I am risen". The Gregorian chant melody is gentle, soothing and profound. Such a precise depiction of the relationship between the Father and the Son on the morning of the Resurrection can only have been inspired by the Holy Ghost!

And then, after the sweetness of the morning, comes the triumph! We begin to realize the immense victory that has just occurred, and the gradual, "Haec dies", gradually takes off in lyrical flights, leading us logically to the sublime Alleluia, in the 7th mode: now this is it! This is Easter! And then the sequence begins! the "Victimae paschali laudes". Sequences are rare in the Liturgy, reserved for very special occasions, and what occasion is more special than the Resurrection of Our Lord? In this masterpiece, composed in the XIth century, probably by a Franciscan friar, we find one of the most beautiful summary of this great mystery:

Christians! to the Paschal Victim offer your thankful praises.

The Lamb the sheep redeemeth: Christ, who only is sinless, reconcileth sinners to the Father.

Death and life contended in that conflict stupendous: the Prince of Life, who died, deathless reigneth.

Speak, Mary, declaring what thou sawest wayfaring.

"The tomb of Christ who now liveth: and likewise the glory of the Risen.

Bright Angels attesting, the shroud and napkin resting.

Yea, Christ my hope is arisen: to Galilee He goeth before you."

We know that Christ is risen, henceforth ever living: Have mercy,

Parish activities:

Registered and active parishioners should call well ahead of the baptism to get the form. A class will be provided. The form should be submitted before the ceremony.

Holy Matrimony:

Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Catholic Church. There is a six-month preparation prior the desired date of wedding. It is available for registered and active parishioners.

First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year. Adults who didn't receive some sacraments or who have questions about their reception should talk to the Pastor who will advise the candidates.
