FROM THE PASTOR

As we publish this week bulletin, a lot happened since the last one! We had a tremendous Triduum with the grace to have Solemn High ceremonies thanks to the presence of a Deacon of the Institute of the Good Shepherd.

As we enjoyed Sunday of Easter with friends and families, we woke up the following day saddened by the passing of Pope Francis. What a grace to pass from this world to the next during the Octave of the Resurrection. We all know that he suffered much during his last hospitalization. Mass of Easter Monday was said for his repose and last Wednesday, we had a Requiem Mass. As you know, his remains were placed in the magnificent Basilica of Saint Mary Major in Rome following his will. Let us continue to pray for his repose!

Now, this week will see the Conclave in which a new Pope will be chosen by the College of Cardinals under the motion of the Holy Ghost. It is indeed our duty to pray for the new Pope and promise obedience as we all did the day of our Baptism, Confirmation. As you know, obedience to the Pope is not optional in the Catholic Church: Pope Boniface VIII, Papal Bull *Unam Sanctam*, 1302: "*We declare, say, define, and pronounce that it is absolutely necessary for the salvation of every human creature to be subject to the Roman Pontiff.*" The Code of Canon Law states: Can. 1404 *The First See is judged by no one.* We have seen imprudent stands and words against previous Popes and the last Pontificate has seen such sins on the internet as well as posture. Let us pray for a Pope that will bring us Unity, Peace and clarity as called by some of the Cardinals before entering in the Conclave. We are people of Hope and, we accept with Joy God's will! Let us all be united in prayers during the Conclave and promise our submission to the Holy Father!

A timely saint

At a time when the Church is in mourning, in the midst of Easter joys, and the tractations and uncertainties of the coming conclaves are in full swing, it is surely a sign of providence that the feast of Saint Catherine of Siena falls on Wednesday. She is certainly the saint to pray to these days, and a model to follow for all Catholics concerned about the future of the Church.

The youngest of a very large family (24 brothers and sisters), Catherine heard the call to consecrate herself to God at an early age. At the age of sixteen, she became a Dominican tertiary, while living a life of austerity and prayer in the midst of her family. She took a vow of virginity, but the small group of friends who listened to her and supported her (the Caterinis) called her “mom”. Asceticism and prayer helped her to live in close union with Christ, while remaining preoccupied with the realities of life. She helped the poor and sick of Siena, and wrote to the powerful of this world.

Her main concern was the unity of the Church. Unashamedly, she wrote a searing letter to the Pope, then in Avignon, urging him to return to Rome. She even went in search of him. When Western Christendom was divided between several popes, she supported Urban VI, deploying a wealth of activity and diplomacy to rally the Church around him.

She also took part in the struggles between Italian cities. She, the recluse of Siena, traveled tirelessly as a mediator in northern Italy and southern France. Yet this boundless activity is not the whole of Saint Catherine. It was only the apparent face of an intense mystical life, with ecstasies during which her disciples, amazed, copied the prayers that escaped her lips. This is the model of what lay people can do for the Church in these difficult times: a life of intense prayer and offering for the Church, for the future Pope. This activity of St. Catherine of Siena, this effectiveness with the Pope even in very dark times for the Church, came from a far more important aspect of her life: her mad love of Our Lord, whom she lovingly contemplated night and day!

Saint Catherine of Siena, pray for us! Pray for the Church!

Parish activities:

Baptism:

Registered and active parishioners should call well ahead of the baptism to get the form. A class will be provided. The form should be submitted before the ceremony.

Holy Matrimony:

Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Catholic Church. There is a six-month preparation prior the desired date of wedding. It is available for registered and active parishioners.

First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year. Adults who didn’t receive some sacraments or who have questions about their reception should talk to the Pastor who will advise the candidates.
