Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year. Adults who didn't receive some sacraments or who have questions about their reception should talk to the Pastor who will advise the candidates.

O most loving Heart of my only love Jesus, not being able to love, honor and glorify you according to the extent of the desire that you give me, I invite Heaven and Earth to do it for me; and I unite myself with these ardent Seraphim to love you.

O Heart all burning with love, why do you not inflame Heaven and Earth with your purest flames to consume all that they enclose, so that all creatures breathe only your love!

Change me all into a Heart to love you, by consuming me in your most intense ardor.

O divine fire, O all pure flames of the Heart of my only love Jesus, burn me without pity, consume me without resistance!

O love of Heaven and Earth, come, come all into my Heart to reduce me to ashes!

O devouring fire of the Divinity, come, come and burst upon me! Burn me, consume me amid your most lively flames, which give life to those who die there. Amen.

This is the prayer of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. She is one of the few privileged to have heard the Sacred Heart. She made a promise to Jesus when she was five years old: "My God, I consecrate my purity to you and vow perpetual chastity to you".

In 1671, she entered the Visitation convent in Paray-le-Monial after Our Lord said to her: "This is where I want you". Then he revealed her vocation: to unite herself in his Passion and to be an apostle of his love.

For two years, she had three apparitions during which she received the revelation of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. A Jesuit father, Claude de la Colombière, himself promotor of the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, became her spiritual director. In following her spiritual life and guiding her, he shortly realized that God had chosen her for a special mission that himself was trying to promote. Therefore, he asked her to write everything she heard from Our Lord. Even if she didn't enjoy the idea she nevertheless obeyed. She died Oct. 17, 1690.

FROM THE PASTOR

Already passing mid-October! Tempus fugit! Of course, we didn't forget the 3rd edition of the parish's Oktoberfest. This year it is mid-October as the beginning of the month was very busy for all of us with different activities. That's right, every weekend is busy with Catechism, Men's group, the upcoming Women's group, Youth group, Altar boys practice; all without counting other activities.

These works are not superfluous! It is necessary! We paused other projects such as the driveway and parking lot who suffer bumps and cracks as well. We must prioritize, nevertheless we won't skip the work unless we are willing to witness more damages in the future.

Most of the work is done by parishioners... very few! If we have at every call twenty men, then the work will be quick and easy on all. We should be thankful to have skilled parishioners dedicating their time even time off work for the comfort of the community.

Soon, we will enjoy a kitchen with improvements to help the ladies who offer you some food on Sundays. The parish is alive, much alive, you can join the wagon and help as there is always room for volunteers in many ways. Thank you to all for your work!
