FROM THE PASTOR

Graduation! Congratulations! It is that time! We are reaching the end of the Academic year! Colleges had or are having their graduation! Seminaries are ending their year (in the US) with ordinations! Our Homeschool co-op ended the academic year last week!

While some are happy and ready to embrace the joy of Summer, others are sad because they won't see their friends as often as during the year! We all should enjoy! First, liturgically because the end of academic year is during a very rich time after Easter. We just had Ascension, and we are going into the feast of Pentecost followed by Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi, Saints Peter and Paul. It is the opening of the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus where we will say the Litany every day and renew our consecration to the Sacred Heart or doing it, if you have not done it yet.

Second, we will start to slow down our lives. The children are going to be freer and will have an irresistible desire to be outdoors. That will benefit all nerves, the one of the parents, theirs and everyone benefiting vitamin D. What about my soul?

Often, we are very good in resting physically, enjoying long walks, the sun, BBQs and friends. What do I do for my soul? How do I reset it? Rest it? Restore it? In these Summer months, we all should think about our soul and our relationship to God. It should be a time of prayer with attention to quality. For instance, Mass will still be celebrated daily at the parish, activities will continue. It is also a time to take care of building and grounds enjoying the company of fellow parishioners while serving. Let us give a breathe to our soul, a better contact with Our Lord, a time of conversion!

Apostle of Germany

Born around 680 AD in England, Saint Boniface is an emblematic figure of evangelization in Europe. Known as the apostle of the Germans, his life and works have had a profound impact on the history of the Catholic Church. Winfrid, his birth name, spent his early years in the solitude of the cloister, devoting himself to a life of prayer and meditation. This formative period was crucial in preparing him for the great plans God had for him. From an early age, he distinguished himself by a fervent life and solid virtues, laying the foundations for his future mission. He received an education in theology and literature in the Benedictine Abbey of Nursling, near Winchester (the original one...), where he was ordained a priest. He soon formed the ambitious project of taking the Gospel to Germania, a region still largely idolatrous. With the support of Pope Gregory II, who granted him full authority to preach the Gospel, Winfrid, now Boniface, embarked on this mission with unwavering zeal. A few years later, Gregory II consecrated him bishop. In recognition of his apostolic success, Pope Gregory III sent Boniface the pallium, symbolizing his authority, and established him primate of all Germania. He was also appointed legate of the Holy See, strengthening his authority and influence over the local churches. These titles testified to the Holy See's confidence and support for Boniface and his missionary work. He establishes monasteries under the rule of Saint Benedict, creates dioceses. He himself became Archbishop of Mainz, and it is said that he presided over the anointing of the Frankish King Pepin the Short in 752 in Soissons. On June 5, 754, Saint Boniface, then aged over 70, was murdered by pagans along with fifty-two companions. Looking today at the Church in Germany, we should more than ever pray to him.

Parish activities:

Men's group, Women's group, Youth group once a month, Conference on Wednesdays every other week, St. Joseph Men's group work, Saint Ann's meal group, Catechism for Sacraments, Altar boys, Homeschool Co-op twice a week, Adoration twice a week. Volunteering in church kitchen, church cleaning, Ushers, Collections counting, Schola, Choir. Not yet in, talk to a priest!

Confessions:

Are heard before each Mass and on demand.

Sacraments:

Saint Stanislaus parish in Winchester offers exclusively the Traditional Latin Mass and uses the Traditional Ritual.

Baptism:

Registered and active parishioners should call well ahead of the baptism to get the form. A class will be provided. The form should be submitted before the ceremony.

Holy Matrimony:

Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Catholic Church. There is a six-month preparation prior the desired date of wedding. It is available for registered and active parishioners.

First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year. Adults who didn't receive some sacraments or who have questions about their reception should talk to the Pastor who will advise the candidates.
