A shepherd for unity

John Kuntsevych's (1580-1623), born in present-day Ukraine, followed his calling and abandoned his merchant career and joined the Greek Catholic Basilian Order, taking the name Josaphat. He became a priest, and in 1617, Bishop of Polotsk. As pastor of a vast diocese encompassing all of present-day Belarus, he was a supporter of the idea of the return of Orthodoxy to unity with Rome.

In the encyclical "Ecclesiam Dei", Pope Pius XI wrote: "In the Archbishop of Polotsk, Josaphat, we rightly see a great pride and support for the Eastern Slavs. Under the influence of divine inspiration, he understood that he could best contribute to the restoration of unity by preserving the Eastern rite in the universal Church. Concerned for the unity of his countrymen with the Chair of St. Peter, he sought everywhere ways to build and strengthen unity. He did this with such great force, yet gentleness, and so fruitfully that his enemies themselves called him "winner of souls".

Josaphat's pastoral zeal and success in building the unity of the Church earned him many enemies. On November 12, 1623, after morning services, his residence in Vitebsk was attacked by a mob of enraged people: "Beat, kill the papist!" they shouted. One of the attackers struck him with a club, the other with an axe. Dragged out into the yard, his body was abused: shot, kicked, mocked, and then thrown into the Dvina River.

The death of the Josaphat did not mark the end of his work; on the contrary, it marked the beginning of his greatest successes. Conversions to Catholicism and healings achieved through the martyr's intercession were repeatedly reported. All but one of his assassins and his former fierce enemy, the Orthodox archbishop, converted.

Saint Josaphat was beatified on May 16, 1643, by Urban VIII, and canonized on June 29, 1867, by Pius IX. He is the patron saint of reconciliation and unity for quarreling families, marriages, neighbors and nations.

Parish activities:

Confessions:

Are heard before each Mass and on demand.

Baptism:

Registered and active parishioners should call well ahead of the baptism to get the form. A class will be provided. The form should be submitted before the ceremony.

Holy Matrimony:

Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Catholic Church. There is a six-month preparation prior the desired date of wedding. It is available for registered and active parishioners.

First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year.
