First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year. Adults who didn't receive some sacraments or who have questions about their reception should talk to the Pastor who will advise the candidates.

It is a duty to pray for the dead! As you know, the souls in Purgatory can no longer merit for themselves or alleviate their suffering in any way. But we can! We can merit for them, we can alleviate their suffering tremendously, and even shorten their stay.

And the Church begs us to do so, particularly during this month of November. She opens wide the floodgates of Divine Mercy, allowing us to earn a plenary indulgence for the souls in Purgatory, every day for 8 days, from November 1st to November 8th.

What is a plenary indulgence? When we go to confession, our sins are forgiven, but there is still an attachment to sin that remains, as well as a need for justice. Sin is an injustice, and so must be repaired. This why we do penance here on earth, and why there is Purgatory, to achieve this purification from our attachment to sin and to redress the balance of justice. A plenary indulgence, given by the Church in certain circumstances, erases all this attachment and debt, cancels the time we should have done in Purgatory.

During these 8 days, the Church gives us the opportunity to earn a plenary indulgence (once a day), that we apply to the souls in Purgatory. Meaning that every time we do get the indulgence, a soul in Purgatory is freed and goes straight to Heaven. All you have to do is pray at a (Catholic cemetery) for the Souls in Purgatory, and fulfill the usual conditions for receiving a plenary indulgence: going to confession (8 days before or after), being detached from sin (even venial sin), receiving Holy Communion (every day you want to receive an indulgence) and praying to the intentions of the Holy Father (also to be repeated for each indulgence).

You can also earn a plenary indulgence on All Souls Day, by visiting a parish church or a public oratory and reciting an Our Father and Apostles' Creed. You can only get one plenary indulgence per day.

If you can't fulfill of the conditions, you can still earn partial indulgences which will ease tremendously the pains of the Poor Souls. So let us take advantage of this shower of graces!

FROM THE PASTOR

The Sunday before All Saints is the feast of Christ the King. Why? Because Pius XI wanted to point out the fact that the King is leading his subjects, and Christ is leading us to Heaven where only Saints are. He must reign that we can go to the Kingdom.

Why waiting the 20th century to institute such a feast? It was the will of the Pope to institute that feast seeing the growing secularism that was going on in the world. Two promoters worked for 6 years to promote the feast. Georges and Marthe de Noaillet, founder of Action catholique de femmes (Catholic women association), spent their time to see hundreds of bishops, thousands of faithful asking them to sign a petition requesting the feast and an encyclical instituting the Royalty of Our Lord over the world. They helped the Pope to affirm the title after the war in 1925 and the secularism that was all over.

It is noticeable to see how lay people were able to influence, to help the Pope. Our Lord must reign in our minds by submission to the doctrine, our wills by obeying laws and precepts of God, in our hearts by loving Him, in our bodies by serving Him. He must reign in our societies as he is the only Savior that we have, Savior of the world.

As we are in time of crisis, God expects something from us! It is a privilege that God wants us to be hic et nunc to serve Him. Therefore, the answer must be Holiness as our ancestors answered crisis before. That is the only way to restore the Kingdom of Our Lord. We must choose a Standard as St. Ignatius invites us in his Exercises. Let us rally His banner and answer according to His Divine Will!
