On Mount Gargan, in Italy, Saint Michael appeared in 492. The Archangel appeared in many places in Europe that can draw a sword over the continent.

God wants us to honor the angels especially the one who was victory over the devil. Quis ut Deus? This is battlefield cry by which he gathered all faithful angels. Therefore, it is very appropriate that he became protector of the Church. Saint Gregory saw the Archangel in the sky of Rome placing his sword in its scabbard to signify the end of the plague and God's wrath.

“In the year 492, a man named Gargan was grazing his flocks in the countryside. One day, a bull fled into the mountains, where they searched for it in vain at first. An arrow was shot; but this arrow returned to wound the one who had shot it. Faced with this marvel, it was thought necessary to consult the neighboring bishop. The prelate ordered three days of fasting and prayer. At the end of the three days, the Archangel Saint Michael appeared to the bishop telling him that this cavern, where the bull had retired, was under his protection, and that God wanted it to be consecrated under his name and in honor of all the Angels. Accompanied by his clergy and his people, the pontiff went to this cavern, which he found already arranged in the form of a church. The divine mysteries were celebrated there, and soon, in this very place, a magnificent temple arose where the divine Power had worked great miracles. At all times the Holy Church has had the greatest veneration for the glorious Archangel, she has favored his cult, established brotherhoods in his honor; she shows him presenting to God the souls of the just departed and invites us to invoke him to obtain, at the hour of death, the last triumph over the spirits of darkness.”

Quis ut Deus? Or מי כאלו. Who is like God? It is rare to know the name of angels and we should not inquire angels name. The Archangel is named 3 times in the book of Daniel. Sunday we will celebrate the feast of the Archangel.

He has a special place in the world. He became the chief of angel's army after the sin of pride from angels. He won over them with all faithful angels. He has many tasks: carrying souls to God, protecting the Church, guardian of the Vatican City as well as Germany, France, Ukraine, and many cities. He is also the patron saint of police officers, military, mariners, and paratroopers. He has many churches dedicated to him.

The most famous places are the Monte Gargano in Italy, the oldest shrine, and the Mont Saint Michel in France where French paratroopers will jump this Sunday as every year. On our daily life, we call him in our spiritual needs in the most famous prayer: Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Pope Leo XIII asked to say certain prayers after low mass in order to protect Church against the attack of the enemy. In this troubled time, it will be wise to pray that prayer often for the needs of Church that God allows the Archangel to tigh the enemy and “*thrust into hell Satan, and al the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls*”. Pray to protect Church and our souls.
