## The Little Way

This week will see revolutionary saints. Saints who brought a new way to the Church, a spiritual way. They gave something that is unique. Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus, a Carmelite nun cloistered who became one of the most known saints of the 19th c., patroness of Missionaries. Doctor of the Church, she democratized sainthood bringing a new way: the little way.

As we know, we are all called to holiness. The little way of spiritual childhood offers a new way to become saint freeing from the constraints of perfection and justice.

The way to become saint is no longer given to efforts and virtues, but to the permanent action of God in us who inspires each one to make the gesture of love to be made. A true mysticism given to all, democracy in holiness. There is one way to become holy is to be opened to God's love, to abandon oneself to his infinity mercy, to be consumed by his love, to let God purify oneself entirely through ordinary life. Holiness is then our human weakness drowned in divine mercy.

Using our weaknesses, to accept our infirmities as an instrument of grace to be loved by the Father. Then, we work on who we are to transform our lives before transforming the World by uniting ourselves to the Holy Cross.

“O Our Father in Heaven,  
Who, through Saint Therese of the Child Jesus, wish to remind the world  
Of the merciful love that fills your heart  
And the filial trust that one must have in you,  
We humbly thank you for having filled with so much glory  
She who was always your faithful child  
And for giving her a marvelous power  
To attract to you each day a very great number of souls  
Who will praise you eternally.  
Saint Therese of the Child Jesus,  
Remember your promise to do good on Earth,  
Spread abundantly your rain of roses on those who invoke you,  
And obtain for us from God the graces that we await from his infinite goodness.”

#### **FROM THE PASTOR**

Silentium! Why keeping silence in the church? Modern societies do not like silence. We are surrounded by noise and that is why it becomes difficult to listen to God. The church is a place where reigns silence. Unfortunately, it happens that even in church silence is not fully respected. Silence allows us to appease our faculties to direct them to God exclusively. The best example is the annual retreat where time is dedicated being with God and to remain in silence.

To remain in silence, there are some steps to follow: first, to leave phones and electronic distractions at home or in your car. The church is not a place where we need a phone. Second, to be on time at Mass for instance to appease our faculties and direct them towards the Tabernacle, third to concentrate and not looking at people in the pews judging or blaming parents for their children.

We can talk but to God only who is waiting us in the Tabernacle where we can pray, give thanks, praise, ask forgiveness... to be united to Him. Therefore, it is not appropriate to talk in church even at a lower tone or murmuring. Will you talk to someone if Our Lord would appear in front of you? Probably not! Remember He is in church!

To respect the prayer of parishioners, we should make that effort. The clergy prays every Morning together in thanksgiving, meditation and the office of Terce. They remain in silence up to the end of their prayers. We should respect that time unless there is an emergency. Let's all make that effort in our parish! We will be able to hear and listen to Our Master!
