FROM THE PASTOR

Evil shall not prevail! It is with these words that Pope Leo XIV greeted the World on May 8th the day of his election. As we wrote last week, the World made a choice that wasn't God's one. With the election of H. Em. Robert F. Prevost, we can see that everyone should be happy: born and raised in the US from European descent parents, his mother being from Spain and his father from France and Italy. He is a missionary who spent most of his priesthood in Peru being named Bishop of Chiclayo in 2014, then a Cardinal in 2023. He speaks multiple languages: English, Spanish, Italian, French and read German.

The Church was praying for unity and clarity, and we have a man of whom reputation is to build bridges; clearly a man of Peace as he stated on the Balcony. He is a man of order as we can see that he read his statement from St. Peter's square. Petrus, qui sibi nomen imposuit Cælestinus...

While we are in the midst of celebrating the election of a new Pope, whose Mass for the “beginning of the Petrine ministry” (no more good old-fashioned Coronation Mass...) takes place this Sunday, the treasures of the liturgical calendar offer us the beautiful and ever-mysterious feast of Saint Peter Celestine (understand Saint Peter of Murrone, who reigned under the name of Celestine V).

Peter, the eleventh of twelve children was born to a poor Italian farmer in 1215, and received a more meticulous education than his brothers, thanks to the extraordinary intelligence and piety he showed from an early age. As a child, he would naively tell his mother about the visits he received from the Angels and the Blessed Virgin. Still young, he resolved to leave the world for solitude. For three years, despite his daily fast, he was assailed by all kinds of thoughts of discouragement, sensuality and voluptuousness; but he was strengthened by frequent visions of the Angels. He consented to receive the priesthood, in order to find in the Eucharist a support against temptations. His holiness started to attract disciples: this was the origin of this branch of the Order of Saint-Benedict, whose religious are called Celestines. They lived in huts made of thorns and branches. Far more austere than his fellow monks, Peter ate only very black and hard bran bread, fasting for four Lenten feasts and generally eating only raw herbs once every three days. Covered with instruments of penance, he slept on iron rather than on earth: a heavenly voice came to order him to reduce this excessive practice of mortification. After an unprecedented 27 months of vacancy in the Holy See, the choice of cardinals sought out Peter, at almost 80, who took the name Celestine V; but a few months later, judging himself to be beneath such a heavy burden, he abdicated the sovereign pontificate. Placed under custody by his successor Boniface VIII, who was afraid the legitimacy of the renunciation could be contested, he died of old age in 1296. He will go down in history as the pope who renounced, and be a bit forgotten, until his story will become popular again many years later, when Pope Benedict XVI renounced.

Parish activities:

Sacraments:

Saint Stanislaus parish in Winchester offers exclusively the Traditional Latin Mass and uses the Traditional Ritual.

Baptism:

Registered and active parishioners should call well ahead of the baptism to get the form. A class will be provided. The form should be submitted before the ceremony.

Holy Matrimony:

Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Catholic Church. There is a six-month preparation prior the desired date of wedding. It is available for registered and active parishioners.

First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year. Adults who didn’t receive some sacraments or who have questions about their reception should talk to the Pastor who will advise the candidates.
