FROM THE PASTOR

The best penance in Lent is the one that come to us not the one I chose. This is probably the most difficult one. Nobody likes the unexpected, we tend to be willing to be in control, in charge of our lives. That's human! The difference with our Faith is something very demanding: abandonment! Surrender to God. A nice expression we like to read in lives of saints but to apply, how is it?

Nevertheless, abandonment is the first stage of union to God, to conform our will to His. Then, we the unexpected comes to us, we should accept it with Faith and full confidence in God. You probably remember the little booklet: Abandonment to Divine Providence from Fr. Jean-Pierre de Caussade: *You do well to give yourself up entirely and almost solely to the excellent practice of an absolute abandonment to the will of God. In this lies for you all perfection.*

Sometimes, the struggles are that challenging that there is no other choice than to turn to God. This is his calling. Like a professor testing his students, God, who knows everything, is asking more of us. Lent is a perfect occasion to practice it, to bend our will, to do something we do not usually such as doing some sacrifices, giving up superfluous objects, being generous to your community. There are numerous examples of what we can do. Also, if you pray and ask Him, He will murmur it to you.

Lent is a learning process always and every new.

Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Catholic Church. There is a six-month preparation prior the desired date of wedding. It is available for registered and active parishioners.

First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year.
