FROM THE PASTOR

Second week of Lent! Every day, we receive this challenge. It is a little something to encourage us, to motivate us in the long run of Lent. The second week is either the one that stabilizes us or the one we realize this is already the 2nd week and we still must think about what to do. As we enter in the month of March, remember that Palm Sunday is on March 29th, it'll come fast!

The second Sunday is called Reminiscere due to the first work of the Introit from the Psalm 24. It is Transfiguration Sunday! A Sunday of hope! The Introit calls for mercy, and the verse of the psalm describes our ascend to God! *To thee, O Lord, have I lifted up my soul. In thee, O my God, I put my trust; let me not be ashamed.*

We are truly in tension as we progress in Lent. We are rooted on the ground and raising up our eyes. Uniting our body with mortification and a joyful soul having confidence in the One who delivers me. This is the story of our lives. We are in a constant battle with earthly desires and lifting up our eyes to Heaven. It is sometimes difficult in the tribulation of life to be all the time in the presence of God. Nevertheless, He is here present.

Lent is the time in which we need to take resolution and some should remain after Lent such as prayer practices. The exercise of the presence of God is a perfect one. If we haven't practiced it yet, this Lent is the occasion and then to ask God to be at all times in His Presence. Once in that mode, imagine your life...

Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Catholic Church. There is a six-month preparation prior the desired date of wedding. It is available for registered and active parishioners.

First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year.
