Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year. Adults who didn't receive some sacraments or who have questions about their reception should talk to the Pastor who will advise the candidates.

Saint Anne, Mother of the BVM

Friday will be the feast of Saint Anne, mother of Our Lady. She was from the tribe of Juda and the royal race of David. God had chosen her and gave her graces. She was holy from her youth. She formed a holy couple with Saint Joachim. God made her wait to become a mother. She had to submit herself to this struggle. She obeyed and used it for her sanctification. She became a model of obedience.

The birth of Our Lady was a miracle as the couple was old. It is an honor given to her to become the mother of the Blessed Virgin Mother co-redemptrice of the human race. She formed the heart of Our Lady.

The Catholic Church celebrates her pious maternity. She is honored in the Church since the 5th century. She is the patroness of the city of Innsbruck, Naples and the province of Britany and the province of Quebec. Two major shrines are dedicated to her: one in Britany and the other one in Quebec.

In the basilica of Sainte-Anne-d'Auray, Friday, about 30 000 people will celebrate the feast. Pipes and drums will be heard around! A similar thing can happen in Sainte Anne de Beaupré in Quebec. Most of hymns heard are coming from Saint Louis Marie Grignon. They are sung in every church most Sundays of the year. It is not possible to go to Britany and not hear them.

It is an occasion to pray for all grandmothers!

FROM THE PASTOR

We all did it! We passed the New Hampshire Catholic appeal goal which was \$9669. Through the efforts of 32 families and your clergy, we made the goal. We all know the sacrifices that require such as financial matters.

Almsgiving is "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God.", CCC 2462. "And looking on, he saw the rich men cast their gifts into the treasury. And he saw also a certain poor widow casting in two brass mites. And he said: Verily I say to you, that this poor widow hath cast in more than they all: For all these have of their abundance cast into the offerings of God: but she of her want, hath cast in all the living that she had." Luke 21, 1-4.

The launch of the NHCA was April 28, 2024, when I preached on tithing. We did the goal in three months with only a portion of families that come to the parish. That is phenomenal! It is the second year that we match the goal.

On that tithing homily, I offered a spiritual way of tithing as we are called to give every day of our lives by Our Lord Jesus Christ. Malachi 3:7-10: *"Return to me, and I will return to you, says the Lord of hosts.... Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house, and try me in this, says the Lord of hosts: Shall I not open the floodgates of heaven, to pour down blessing upon you without measure?"* When giving we call God's blessing as we return the gifts He gave us. It is to recognize that all we have is coming from God. You all know: "But when thou dost alms, let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doth." Mt. 6, 3.

What happens now? You can continue to give as whatever given will come back to the parish assessment free meaning not being taxed. Tithing is a spiritual way of life. If you haven't contributed yet, don't worry it is not too late! May God bless you.
