Already Mid-Lent! Tempus fugit! Back in the day, when Lent was a real 40 days of fasting and abstinence (partial on Mon., Tues. Thursday & Sat. in the US since 1946), a pause was necessary. Mid-lent was a celebration as Mardi gras. Why?

Maybe you know that eggs have a due date of approximately 23 days. Before no eggs during Lent but they were allowed on Thursday of mid-Lent not to waste them. That is why, eggs are a symbol of Easter because it was the day we could have them again. Nowadays, we all look for chocolate eggs as the rules of fasting changed.

Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Catholic Church. There is a six-month preparation prior the desired date of wedding. It is available for registered and active parishioners.

First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year.
