The cathedral of the world! On November 9, the Church celebrates the feast of the dedication of the Basilica of the Most Holy Savior, better known as the Basilica of Saint John Lateran, one of the four major basilicas. And it's not an insignificant feast. Indeed, this church has a very special history, a very special importance in the Church.

First and foremost, it was the very first church in the history of Christianity! In fact, just after the Edict of Milan by which the Emperor Constantine officially recognized Christianity in the Roman Empire, in 313, this same Emperor gave his palace to Pope Sylvester to build a basilica, a temple in honor of the Most High God, the Most Holy Savior, Our Lord Jesus Christ. And so, on the property donated by the emperor, the first church in Christendom was built.

But that's not all! Noblesse oblige, and this first church could be none other than the church of the Bishop of Rome, the Pope's cathedral! The Cathedral of cathedrals, the heart of the Catholic Church, the See of Peter. These words are inscribed on the pediment of the basilica: "*omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput*" (Mother and head of all the churches of the City and of the world). When a new pope is elected, he goes to St John Lateran to take possession of his cathedral, just as a new bishop takes possession of his diocesan cathedral. Until the Renaissance, popes always resided in the Lateran papal palace, the seat of their authority.

On November 9, 324, the church was solemnly consecrated by Pope Sylvester I, being also the first church to be consecrated. The dedication or consecration of a church is a very ancient, very beautiful, very sacred ceremony, in which a human building is made divine, becomes God's exclusive for the perpetuation of the Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

An interesting thing to note is that it is traditionally forbidden to consecrate a church that would have only a wooden altar. But this Basilica is an exception. Hidden under the marble and the canopy, there is a poor, simple wooden altar. The altar of the popes in the catacombs, the altar on which Saint Peter himself offered the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass...

FROM THE PASTOR

Time after Pentecost is a symbol for the pilgrimage on earth to Heaven. At the end of the Liturgical year, we see some added Sundays after Epiphany. It is because of movable feasts. Easter and therefore Pentecost do not have a fixed calendar date. Nevertheless, the Church wants us to see the Liturgical year as a pilgrimage, that is why we repeat year after year the same reading that are around the proper of Mass.

Nevertheless, the Mass of the 24th Sunday after Pentecost is the last one of the year before the First of Advent. To reach that Mass, because of movable feasts, we add these Sundays after Epiphany. Even if there are only 23 Sundays after Pentecost the last one will remain the same: the 24th.

As we reach the end of the Liturgical year and will start a new one, let us think about the past year. It is always profitable to do some examination of conscience. What were my resolutions last year? Was I faithful? What are going to be my resolutions for this new year?

Good resolutions are the one that are profitable for my spiritual life and my community. It is necessary to progress in spiritual life year after year to elevate my soul towards Heaven as I am a pilgrim striving to be closer to God. It is also necessary that my progresses serve my community, first, my family then my church community and my workplace. If I am not serving well, who am I serving best? The good thing is we start anew this year. It starts here and now! This year, who am I going to serve? In our parish, there are plenty of occasions to serve God and the Church. Let all make that effort as a preparation for Christmas! That can be my gift to Our Lord.
