First Confession, First Holy Communion & Confirmation:

Preparation for the reception of sacraments is available for families registered and active at the parish. The preparation is announced before the beginning of the academic year. Adults who didn't receive some sacraments or who have questions about their reception should talk to the Pastor who will advise the candidates.

Spiritual exercises of Saint Ignatius of Loyola

What are the exercises? You might have heard the exercises of Saint Ignatius or even better you attended a retreat with the exercises. The short answer could be any manner to examine your conscience, the way to meditate, to contemplate, to pray vocally or mentally. That is already a lot!

At the beginning of the exercises, Saint Ignatius takes the analogy with physical exercises. One can start walking as going for a walk up to running. There is a progression. If tomorrow, one of you tells me that you are going to run the NYC Marathon, I will ask you about your training and for how long because without proper training.

It is the same in our relationship to God. There is a progression, a way to pray, to meditate, to enter in contact with Him. It is an exercise! Therefore, it requires an ascetic way of life like athletes have an ascetic and strict diet to get in the shape they desire for their sport.

At the end of his life, he wrote an autobiography: A pilgrim's journey, in which he reads his life and seeks how God worked on him thinking this is God's way for all. He tried to formalize it in writing.

Do not try to read the exercises doing them alone. This is usually a book for the priest who preaches them. It is a way to enter in the intimate knowledge of Christ from the beginning of his life to the end.

In the US, many retreats house offer them! Try them!

FROM THE PASTOR

Last week, we have had the honor to receive Very Rev. Fr. Luis Barrero, Superior General of the Institute of the Good Shepherd. He enjoyed his visit very much. He saw the growth of the parish and it rejoiced his heart. The work of a Major Superior is not very known, even less than the one of a bishop. Of course, a Major Superior is not a bishop even if he enjoys some privileges. He is the Ordinary of the Institute of the Good Shepherd and has jurisdiction over the members as bishops does except the judicial one. The Institute being a society of apostolic life of Pontifical rights, the Superior needs to refer to the Dicastery for Institutes of Consecrated life and Society of Apostolic Life for matters relevant to its competency.

The Institute has 3 elected positions: the Superior General and its two Assistants. Thus, he appoints a General Bursar, a General Secretary for the work of the Mother House. In addition, he appoints the Rector of the Seminary and Superior of a region. The Institute has two districts: South America and Europe. The election takes place every six years during the General Chapter. This will happen in July 2025.

As you can imagine, it is a daily challenge not only to govern the 62 priests of the Institute but also to respond to various questions, requests on addition to meet bishops across the countries in which the Institute is present. Please pray for the Superiors!

This week is the last week of Deacon Krol who will be heading Poland Friday, Aug. 2nd. He will not be on vacations yet as he is on duty for a pilgrimage to Our Lady of Czestochowa. This pilgrimage is a week-long! It was a real pleasure to have him in our parish hoping that you got a chance to talk to him asking what the seminary life is. He will return to the Seminary in September for the last months before his priestly ordination God willing. This Summer is important, and this is the first one as an ordained minister. Please keep him in your prayers! You might invite him again while you salute him before departing!
